

I also understand that the LSAC reserves the right to pursue all suitable courses of action to prevent fraudulent or unauthorized use of its property and to prevent the compromise of secure test material."

- Do not sign the Admit Card prior to the test. You will be asked to sign your Admit Card during the check-in process on the day of the test.
- Pearson VUE takes various steps to ensure that the complete test process goes as per norms. If a Candidate does not sign the Admit Card at the Test Centre or if he/she modifies or alters the above certifying statement in any way, a reporting hold will be placed on his/her LSAT—India result, possibly causing a delay in reporting the score.

Instructions for the Day of the Test

- Candidates are required to reach their assigned Test Centre on or before the reporting time indicated on the front of this Admit Card. Any Candidate reporting after the gates-closing time will not be allowed entry into the Test Centre under any circumstance.
- Candidates **MUST** bring the unsigned LSAT—India Admit Card on the day of the test along with photo identification from the list mentioned below; as without these he/she will not be allowed to test. Candidates will be **required to sign the Admit Card** at the designated place in front of the Invigilator, at the Test Centre.
- Candidates are not required to paste any photo on this Admit Card; as this Admit Card has the printed photo as uploaded by the candidate during registration. Pasting any other photo or altering the printed photo in any way will lead to his/her disqualification and he/she will not be allowed to test.
- The Admit Card shall be available on the website www.pearsonvueindia.com/lsatindia after the registrations are over. In case of loss of this Admit Card, a duplicate may be printed from the website before the day of the test.
- Misuse of this Admit Card will amount to serious misconduct, punishable under the Terms and Conditions.
- Use only a No. 2 or HB Pencil to shade the answer options in the optical mark recognition answer sheet. **Ink is not permitted.**
- Candidates **MUST** bring one of the following valid (original and non-expired) photo identification proof to the Test Centre on the day of the test along with this Admit Card, failing which they will not be allowed to test:
 - **Driving License**
 - **Passport**
 - **UID / Aadhaar Card / E-Aadhaar Card copy**
 - **SC/ ST Certificate with photograph**
 - **Military ID containing candidate's photo**
 - **PAN Card**
 - **Election Card / Voter ID**
 - **Employee ID containing photograph and signature**
 - **Military dependent ID containing candidate's photo**
 - **Photo Identity issued by School/College/University**
- If a registrant for the five-year course does not have any of the above IDs, she/he will be admitted upon presentation of **any two of the following** in original:
 - **Tenth pass Certificate / Mark sheet that has date of birth on it**
 - **School Identity Card (photo)**
 - **Original Admit Card issued by University/Board for twelfth (XII) standard examination with affixed photograph**
- Legal name change (due to marriage or divorce) must be supported by marriage certificate / divorce document.
- Photocopies and attested copies of IDs are **NOT** acceptable. Candidates who are unable to produce the valid IDs (original and non-expired) mentioned above will not be admitted into the testing room and shall not be offered a test-fee refund.
- Persons accompanying the Candidate will not be allowed into the test premises, and no waiting area will be provided.
- Candidates must adhere to the policies, rules and regulations which are available at the www.pearsonvueindia.com/lsatindia website. Invigilators shall have the right to exclude Candidates who fail to follow the Test Centre rules and procedures.
- Only pre-registered Candidates with names appearing on the attendance roster and who have valid Admit Cards and valid IDs (original and non-expired) as mentioned above will be permitted to take the LSAT—India.
- **Candidates are not permitted to bring mobile phones or any type of electronic device to the Test Centre**, as only the Admit Card, valid photo ID, No. 2 or HB pencils, sharpeners and erasers are required for the test. All other articles will have to be left outside the Test Centre at the Candidate's own risk.
- Only analog (non-digital) watches are permitted in the Test Centre.

Candidate's Undertakings

The Candidate hereby irrevocably undertakes and confirms that she/he understands that

- She/he is fully compliant to the eligibility criteria for undertaking the course being conducted by the educational institution/university and no information has been withheld or incorrectly provided.
- She/he shall not hold Pearson VUE liable or accountable for any issues relating to admission/course for which the exam is being conducted.
- She/he shall not violate any privacy policies or security policies of the website of Pearson VUE being used by the Candidate.
- The jurisdiction of any matters relating to administration of the LSAT—India examination by Pearson VUE, shall vest exclusively with the Courts of New Delhi, India, which the Candidate hereby irrevocably submits to.

The LSAT—India is designed to cater to the requirements of any Indian university or college that wishes to adopt it as an admissions criterion. LSAT—India should not be directly or indirectly equated to LSAT®. The scores obtained by a Candidate in LSAT—India will have no relevance for admissions to any foreign university. Furthermore, Candidate acknowledges that eligibility standards for admission to law school are determined solely by the applicable Institutions and not by Pearson VUE.
- Pearson VUE is responsible only for conducting the LSAT—India examination and it holds no responsibility for requisite approvals, consents, or permissions of the concerned regulatory authorities for the educational institution/university for conducting the relevant course, which the Candidate shall ascertain from the concerned institution/university on his/her own.
